A MESSAGE FROM OUR REGIONAL PRESIDENT

I want to welcome all of you to the NNJR Man of the Year Dinner. I extend a hearty Yasher Koach to all of the Men and Youth who are being honored; each one of you has the respect and admiration of your Synagogues, clubs and peers, for all that you do to make a difference.

The stated purpose of the International Federation of Jewish Men's Clubs – to involve Jewish Men in Jewish Life – and each activity of our clubs can help to connect our members and potential members to the greater Jewish Community, and this is good. Success is not always measured by the sheer number of participants. Some programs, such as a Hearing Men's Voices Session, may be more successful with a small group. Others, such as the World Wide Wrap and the Yellow Candle Program, work best with as wide a participation base as possible.

As I stated at the President's Dinner, my primary focus over my term as President will be focusing efforts on servicing our clubs. You are our reason for being here. We do this through providing resources, such as people and expertise, and sharing what works in other clubs. To this end, we started out with a club leader training session over the summer, where one or more attendees from a large percentage of our clubs participated, and learned about many of the resources available. Our district meetings, which were started as a means to facilitate interactions between club leaders, continue, as well as well as our training sessions at regional board meetings. Our club liaisons will continue to reach out to each club, and we reinstituted the E-Buzz, an electronic publication which we hope will continue to facilitate disseminating information to club leaders. I hope to have an opportunity to visit every club in our region during my term as president. I want to hear from you as to what your questions and concerns are, as well as about your successes.

Share your successful events with your peers – The FJMC Torch Awards, given out at the convention, provide recognition for clubs who do this. Another FJMC initiative, the Quality Club Award, recognizes clubs who achieve a level of participation over a range of FJMC, Regional and club activities. Last year, 13 of our clubs were recognized as Quality Clubs by the FJMC. More clubs than any other region. I want to increase that number this year. The FJMC Convention, which will be held in Ocean County, Southern California, July 13th through July 17th, 2011, is what FJMC does best. Let us share with you why attending an FJMC convention will help your club, and why the return rate of guys who have attended the

convention is as high as it is.

As you know, last year, under Eric Weis' stewardship, we initiated the "Youth of the Year" award. What a great way to recognize our young people who take active roles in their synagogue community.

We continue to support our clubs financially as well. Through the regional raffle, our clubs take was over \$8000. Tonight's Dinner Journal will share 25% of the revenue with the club. Through rebates on Yellow Candles, our clubs who order through the region share additionally, as well as have a reduced cost per case.

I am grateful to our NNJR team, whose efforts to support our clubs, allows me to kvell about our successes. Jeff Schulman, NNJR Executive VP, has been relentless in his efforts in support of our clubs. Through the efforts of our VP's and district Roshes, Joel Kurtz, Harvey Hershkowitz and David Millman, VP Harvin Freedman, Treasurer Rob Blitzer, Financial Secretary Elliott Brown, Recording Secretary Rich Nebb, and Corresponding Secretary Stu Mantel, we are available to help you. Our trustees include Henry Feinberg, Howard Pearlson, Bruce Pomerantz, Jeramy Saferstein, Adam Shandler, Dan Shifrin, Craig Simon, Jerry Siskind, Joe Wechsler and David Yellin. In addition, our team includes Honorary President Eric Weis, and past presidents Peter Gotlieb, Stu Kaplan, Al Davis and Lance Adelson, who each continue to offer support and counsel to our board and to me, which supports or efforts to support our clubs.

Our Region honors Rob Blitzer, of Beth El Synagogue in East Windsor as our Regional Man of the Year. Our current Treasurer, Rob has been a leader in bringing our members together though his efforts in events such as our multi-regional retreat this past May, when approximately 70 guys shared a weekend of learning, praying, and brotherhood, and our participation in the last FJMC Convention, held in Philadelphia, where we brought over 40 participants, our largest attendance at such an event.

Our Man of the Year Dinners are the signature event of the region. The Dinner Chairs, Harvey Hershkowitz for the Northern Dinner, and David Yellin for the Southern Dinner, have done an outstanding job in making it seem so easy. Stu Mantel, Journal Chair, has also done a yeoman's job at coordinating the efforts of obtaining bios, ads and making this a truly memorable commemorative book.

Tonight we honor a group of volunteers. Indeed, the FJMC, the NNJR, and your clubs run on the efforts of volunteers. You all make a difference in the lives of your families, your clubs, your shuls and the greater Jewish Community, and for that, I congratulate and thank you.

WHAT IS FJMC?



THE FEDERATION OF JEWISH MEN'S CLUBS?

The mission of the Federation of Jewish Men's Clubs is to involve Jewish men in Jewish life. We improve the quality of Jewish life; contribute to the enhancement of our Conservative Jewish identity locally and world-wide; strengthen and build local Jewish Men's Clubs; and increase membership for the purpose of providing excellence in education, training, and social and community activity. Today there are over 25,000 members from Men's Clubs across the United States and Canada. We are growing every day.

Rabbi Samuel M. Cohen created the Federation of Jewish Men's Clubs in 1929 as the National Federation of Jewish Men's Clubs of the United Synagogue of America. Rabbi Cohen brought together leaders from existing Men's Clubs to foster an interchange of ideas and to help them focus on their common needs. Since that time, the FJMC has continued to evolve and currently consists of hundreds of Men's Clubs in Conservative congregations in eighteen regions in North America.

From 1945 to 1985, the late Rabbi Joel S. Geffen (z"I) guided the FJMC. He was engaged by the Jewish Theological Seminary to travel throughout North America in order to expand the influence of the Seminary and to build future synagogue leadership through Men's Clubs. As a result of this strong relationship, the leadership of the FJMC also developed a strong attachment and working relationship with the Jewish Theological Seminary. This relationship with the Seminary and all of the constituent organizations in the Conservative/Masorti Movement remains strong today, fostered by current FJMC leadership and by Rabbi Charles Simon, who joined the FJMC in 1983 as Executive Director.

A major effort of the FJMC is to provide tools and skills to our Men's Clubs. This process began in the late 1930's with the publication of the first Men's Club "President's Manual" and has continued to date. Club and Regional Officers manuals are continuously revised to meet the current changes in the Jewish Community. The current Club Officers Manual is available through the Northern NJ Region.

In addition to these leadership materials, the FJMC has created many exciting programs. Our book and program series "Hearing Men's Voices" contains information on relationships between fathers and sons, men's health issues and interfaith marriages. Our "Art of Jewish Living" series includes books on Shabbat, Passover, Chanukah and Mourning issues. And then there are our videotapes including "Inbound Mercy" program dealing with teenage drunk driving and "The Ties That Bind", a poignant tape taking you through the meaning of wearing Tefillin, the incredible feeling you get from wearing Tefillin and the connection with the Almighty. The World Wide Wrap, now in its eighth year, has grown from this initiative. FJMC programs and materials are highlighted on the FJMC website. Please visit it at: http://www.fjmc.org.

The FJMC plays an important role in the worldwide Conservative/Masorti movement. The current FJMC President, Mark Berlin and Rabbi Charles Simon, our Executive Director, sit on the Leadership Council of Conservative Judaism. The council is composed of the leaders of the Jewish Theological Seminary, the Rabbinical Assembly, the United Synagogue for Conservative Judaism, Women's League and the FJMC. The Leadership Council meets four times a year to determine the agenda of the Conservative Movement. In addition, the FJMC President sits on the boards of other Conservative Judaism, Mercaz and Masorti Olami, the Jewish Theological Seminary, the United Synagogue of Conservative Judaism, Mercaz and Masorti Olami, the World Council of Synagogues. Outside the Conservative Movement, the FJMC also maintains a NGO seat at the UN.





What is the Yellow Candle[™] Program?

The Yellow Candle was conceived in 1983 by FJMC Clubs in Massachusetts and Canada to help keep alive the memory of the Six Million Jews who perished in the Holocaust. It is modeled after the traditional Jewish memorial candle that burns for 24 hours during mourning periods and on the anniversary of the death of a family member.

The candle's yellow wax and symbol depict a Jewish star and strand of barbed wire to remind us of the yellow arm band Jews were forced to wear during the Nazi regime. The photo on the candle shows youngsters departing a concentration camp and emphasizes the importance of teaching our youth the lessons of the Holocaust and of remembering the Six Million.

Interest in the Holocaust is at an all time high. In an age of terrorism and violence, more and more people are sensitive to the fact that genocide is not a private matter limited to the Jewish community. For Jews especially, world events (including never-ending occurrences of anti-Semitism) make memorializing the Holocaust more important than ever. We urge everyone to take a fresh look at the candle program this year. It is today's news. In today's terror-filled world, the lessons of the Holocaust are as timely and relevant this year as they were half a century ago. It is critical that these lessons be learned by the Next Generation.

Who benefits from the Yellow Candle Program?

- **Men's Clubs.** The program provides the Men's Club (or other participating group) a purpose and a significant project upon which to focus. The program is an excellent vehicle for training its members and cultivating volunteers.
- **Synagogues.** The program benefits the synagogue because it unites the congregation through an inter-age effort and provides a focus for Yom HaShoah programming.
- **Communities.** The program benefits the community by bringing the resources that Men's Clubs have at their disposal to aid and assist community observances and to make the public more aware of the lessons of the Holocaust.
- **Our Youth.** The FJMC has established an international scholarship fund "From Darkness into Light," available to members of USY chapters in participating synagogues to help offset the cost of attending the USY Poland or Eastern Europe/Israel Seminar.
- **Charities**. Yellow Candle programs can be a source of funding for other meaningful programs related to Yom HaShoah. For example, the Blue Card Fund benefits indigent survivors. Other clubs target funds for local Holocaust memorials, libraries, gardens, Holocaust Museum trips and scholarships for USY Pilgrimage summer programs.

Rob Blitzer NNJR Man of the Year

Rob and his wife, Jerri, have been involved members of Beth El Synagogue in East Windsor for over 16 years. Jerri, until last year, had been Youth Commissioner and daughters Monica [past USY chapter president] and Stephanie are both very involved with youth groups and social action. Prior to becoming involved with Men's Club, Rob served on the synagogue board including executive positions as Fundraising and later Membership Vice President.

After becoming his club's Man of the Year, Rob left the synagogue board and became Men's Club president. During his first term as president, the Club won a Torch Award for its World Wide Wrap program. During his second stint as club president, sharing the club presidency with Marshall Alter, Beth El Synagogue Men's Club has been awarded the Quality Club Award



at the international level, year after year. In addition to serving on his club's board, Rob now serves as Treasurer on the NNJR regional board.

While he devotes much time to the synagogue and Men's Club, as well as his family, Rob spends most of his time commuting to and working in New York. As Senior Business Analyst at Donovan Data Systems, the leading systems and software company serving the advertising and media business, Rob consults with his clients to ensure they get the most out of the system.

Rob has worked at the Northern New Jersey regional level the past few years to help Jewish guys from Jersey get the most out of FJMC. Two years ago he chaired the convention committee and with his efforts, a record number of attendees from the NNJR community descended upon Philadelphia. Community is critical to fostering the FJMC's mission of involving Jewish men in Jewish life.

The rewards of community and Jewish living may be most evident at regional retreats. This past spring, Rob chaired the biennial tri-region retreat...which this year turned into a very successful quad-region retreat. Rob was able to successfully coordinate with leaders from the Hudson Valley, Middle Atlantic and New York Metro Regions - - that alone is no small feat - - to put on what many consider the most successful multi-region retreat. Aside from the tremendous numbers that attended, the success of the retreat was really measured by the tremendous friendship, learning and experience that the men took with them from retreat.

On the regional level, Rob took over the Treasurer's position on the NNJR board this year. His accounting background should make this an easy enough task for him administer. Rob is also very involved with FJMC's young men's initiative, known as 'hador habah', the next generation - - a name Rob suggested.

This winter, the hope is to have upwards of 100 young men (45 or younger) from around the country attend the Leadership Training Institute. Rob sees the importance of getting young Jewish men involved in Jewish life as a way to ensure the future of FJMC and conservative Judiasm.

CONGREGATION B'NAI ISRAEL, Staten Island

Lewis Saltiel was Born in Alexandria, Egypt 10 years before the end of the Jewish golden era which coincided with a coup d'etat. King Farouk abdicated and the army moved in lead by Nasser the dictator.

Lewis' father Leon and mother Sarah both Sephardim from Salonica, Greece, raised their three children, Batcheva, Joseph and Lewis with a strong Jewish identity. By the age of eight, Lewis accompanied his father to the pre- holiday's activities which gave

him a strong lesson in exercising Tsadaka and involvement within the Congregation and the indigent Jewish communities at large. Several active members of the Greek-Sephardic Congregation would welcome needy families to the center, listened to their plight and GAVE them an appropriate amount of cash to help them celebrate Passover and later the same procedure was repeated before Rosh Hashanah.

This exposure, going to the Synagogue on Shabbat four services and Havdallah as well as learning Hebrew at the Jewish Alliance school prepared him for active involvement later on at various Synagogues in the USA.

Their brief exodus to France in 1957 as a result of the Sinai War landed the family in a suburb of Paris, Gennevilliers. Since there was no Synagogue near the apartment complex inhabited by many other Jews from Egypt, Lewis' family together with their neighbors established a Heder- Kehillah in one of the apartments and held regular services for many years. The organization COJASOR, an affiliate of the American Jewish Philanthropies helped most Jewish immigrants from Egypt acquire this apartment complex.

Lewis with his father and brother, his mother had died in France in 1960, moved to the USA in 1961. They promptly joined a group of families in Queens, NY to establish a new Sephardic Congregation not far from their new residence.

On March 15, 1964 Lewis married Liliane Elia, also born in Alexandria, Egypt. Together they had two sons, Jeffrey and Phillip.

In 1967 they bought a house in Oakwood, Staten Island, attended various Synagogues and in 1970 moved to Huguenot.

The first Hanukkah holiday since moving there, a knock at the door by two gentlemen, Carl Berkowitz and Allan Newman invited Lewis and Liliane to attend a meeting called by several Jewish families residing at the Village Greens complex in Arden Heights. They met at a church community's center in Huguenot. The meeting ushered the formation of The Arden Heights Jewish center later called, through a merger, The Arden heights- Boulevard Jewish Center. Lewis and his family became charter members and Lewis's past education, experience and involvement enabled him to become a member of the board of Trustees and an officer. His Son Jeffrey became a Bar Mitzvah there under the spiritual leadership of Rabbi Pianko. Regrettably due to a change of cultural leadership, Lewis felt that he had to move on to a Congregation which reflected his "Jewish" philosophies more closely.

At Congregation B'Nai Israel, he contacted the president Marvin Shindelman to make arrangements for his younger son Phillip's Bar Mitzvah. As fate would have it, Marvin and Marsha (his wife) Shindelman's daughter, Judith, was married to Lewis's son Jeffrey in 1993, some ten years after their first conversation. The membership at B'Nai Israel lasted about four years with various degrees of minor active involvement.

The following five years Lewis and his family attended services at the Sephardic Synagogue "OR Torah" until soon after Jeffrey's marriage to Judi.


By that time Marvin Shindelman and his wife Marsha had become active members at Congregation B'nai Jeshurun. Together with the warm reception extended by the members and officers of CBJ, it was an easy decision for Lewis and Liliane to join. The thought of keeping the new extended family together during Holidays made it equally appealing. Initially Lewis had doubts whether to become active in Synagogue life again as he had encountered too many negative situations in the various Synagogues he attended in the past. He found CBJ quite different. Several factors convinced him to resume his involvement: Warmth, camaraderie, respect for each other. A true sense of a great family starting with Rabbi Judah Newberger, Cantor Edry, the then president Richard Rachman, the officers, the members of the board of trustees and last but not least the members of the Congregation. CONGREGATION BETH ISRAEL—Scotch Plains


After attending Camp Ramah in the Berkshires for 5 summers, Jordan became involved in Kadima and

Academy for Allied Health Sciences and plans to pursue a career in medicine.




Gabor Muth CONGREGATION BETH Sholom, Teaneck

CONGREGATION TORAT EL—Ocean



Jerry chaired the Rabbi Krief Committee to recognize and celebrate the Rabbi's 25th anniversary as the Rabbi of the PBJC.


