Jerry Siskind

Temple Beth Shalom (Livingston)



Jerry Siskind has served the Northern New Jersey Region (NNJR) of the Federation of Jewish Men's Clubs (FJMC) as a Trustee for many years, and more recently he served as the Region's Recording Secretary. He is a past President, Vice President for Programs, and Recording Secretary of Temple Beth Shalom of Livingston Men's Club. He was the photographer for both organizations, and for many years photographed the Region's Man of the Year Dinners (North and South).

Jerry holds Bachelor's and Master's Degrees in Electrical Engineering from Carnegie-Mellon

University, and has worked at Sperry Systems Management in Great Neck, LI, NY on Oceanographic submarines in the US Navy for 12 years. He worked for ITT Avionics (which split into Exelis, and is now part of Harris) for close to 25 years in two stints on Radar Jamming for all of the US military services retiring in 2016 as the Design Review Chairman. In between, he worked at Bell Laboratories (AT&T and Lucent) in Whippany on cellular base stations, and Fujitsu Network Communications in Pearl River, NY on fiberoptic communications.

While in college (and since) Jerry has worked as a photojournalist for over 50 years. His news and sports pictures have been on major national and international wire service ~1,000 times, and have appeared in LIFE, TIME, NEWSWEEK. US NEWS & WORLD REPORT, and **SPORTS** ILLUSTRATED. His pictures have appeared on the front page of the NY TIMES, WASHINGTON POST, PHILADEPHIA INQUIRER, NEWSDAY (Long Island), BOSTON GLOBE, and the whole back page of the NY DAILY NEWS. He was nominated for a Pulitzer Prize in Photojournalism in 1970. He covered major events including Robert Kennedy's funeral, the 1971 World Series, and Roberto Clemente's 3,000th hit (now on display in the Roberto Clemente Museum in Pittsburgh).


Aaron enjoys smoking meat, collecting rare scotch and cheering for his daughters on the soccer field.







My appreciation for nature and biology, as one who is also a student of Judaism is shown by my favorite (most meaningful quote for me) in Psalm 92:

"How vast Your works, Adonai! Your designs are beyond our grasp."

I led a hike, on a beautiful fall day, for 21 Hebrew school children and parents, in honor of one of our beloved CBJ members. I also led our youth groups on a hike in June. On Tu B' Shevat I led a planting of sunflower seeds, and for Lag B'Omer, I planted a small fig tree with the help of the Hebrew school children.

I greatly appreciate learning from our rabbi, Rabbi Sam Kastel, that a leading Jewish theologian and philosopher of the 20th century, Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel (January 11, 1907-December 23, 1972) often used expressions of awe at his viewing of nature. He said, "Awe precedes faith: it is the root of faith." (Wilderness Torah, Center For Earth-Based Judaism. Wonder and Awe: The Radical Amazement of Abraham Joshua Heschel with Rabbi Mike Comins)

Recently, I did a lesson where I asked the children to picture and draw, what the creation of the world looked like.

Along with another member, an adult walking club was started for exercise and love of nature.

I hope to do other lessons connecting nature with G-d.
