# NNJR Man of the Year Biography & Congratulations

Steve Katz
Congregation B'nai Tikvah (North Brunswick)



I am truly humbled and flattered to be recognized as the FJMC NNJR Manof-the-Year. To be bestowed such an honor does not come without a lot of hard work and support, love, and passion by those around me.

I am originally from Brooklyn growing up in Warbasse, which is a Co-op located on Ocean Parkway. I was always surrounded by family and friends so there never was an opportunity to get into too much trouble. I was a good Jewish boy, "most of the time".



My family belonged to Jewish Center of Brighton Beach, which is a grand Orthodox shul located on Ocean Parkway. Rabbi David Neustein presided over our congregation, which was quite large. Rabbi Neustein was a great speaker and as a child I used to be transfixed by his sermons. Many years later, he still left his mark on me, spiritually and literally, as he was my Business Law Professor in College.

After graduating Mark Twain JHS (SP), and then Lincoln HS, it was off to CUNY Brooklyn College. There, I majored in Accounting. During my Junior year, I was elected the Male Intermural Sports Chairman, running a sports program for over 5,000 "athletes". I was active socially in House Plans, which at Brooklyn College was a local "fraternity/sorority" system, this all cemented my "Good Jewish Boy" reputation.

Upon graduation, I worked on Wall Street for Bear Stearns. #### B'nai Shalom (West Orange)



Donald Batchelder is honored to be selected as the B'nai Shalom 2024/5785 Men's Club Man of the Year. Don has taken leadership roles at B'nai Shalom in recent years, acting as gabbai and member of the Executive Committee, the Board of Trustees, the Ritual Affairs Committee, and the Tzedek Committee. He is grateful that B'nai Shalom has been a center for intense and rewarding Jewish learning. His studies with Rabbi Stanley Asekoff, Jeff Kirschenbaum, Rabbi Michael Monson, Flora Musleah, and Rabbi Robert Tobin, among other mentors, have allowed him to bring Hebrew and musical skills to his leadership of daily, Shabbat, and holiday minyanim. In reflecting on his Jewish growth during nearly 30 years as a B'nai Shalom member, Don acknowledges that he has received far more than he has given.

Don was born in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, and grew up in Montclair, New Jersey. His parents, both ordained Protestant ministers, had chosen Montclair as a place where racial integration was succeeding in the 1960s. Don's musical abilities thrived in the rich environment of Essex County, where he played both piano and trumpet. He earned Bachelors and Masters degrees at The Juilliard School in New York, taking time out for full-time orchestra jobs in Toluca, Mexico and Seoul, Korea. Don's career as a free-lance classical trumpeter in New York began with "backstage trumpet" work with the Metropolitan Opera in 1983, the same year he met a violinist named Lisa at an orchestra rehearsal in Westfield, New Jersey. Not coincidentally, his interest in Judaism began to grow at around the same time. Don and Lisa have been happily married for over 39 years.

Don, Lisa, and their two sons Daniel and Benjamin, joined B'nai Shalom when they moved to West Orange in 1996. His career as a classical trumpet player and music teacher presented challenges to an observant Jewish life, since Broadway, symphonic, and opera performances often take place on Shabbat. However, Don's musical ability also gave him opportunities to serve as *baal tekiah* on the High Holidays, and to perform occasional concerts at the shul, including a series titled "Jewish Songwriters, American Songs" with resident music maven Seth Saltzman. His first experience leading the *musaf* service was in honor of Daniel's bar mitzvah.

Don looks forward to participating in more Men's Club events, including distribution of Yellow Candles, the annual clothing drive, game nights, and Scotch in the Sukkah.

# Highland Park Conservative Temple - Congregation Anshe Emeth (Highland Park)



Spencer Brooks's involvement in Men's Club dates back to his early youth when he and his brother would be asked by Marty Metzger to help deliver Yom Hashoah candles on nearby streets in his childhood community of Cranford. Following his move to Highland Park in 2014, Spencer joined the Highland Park Conservative Temple - Congregation Anshe Emeth (HPCT-CAE) and quickly found himself becoming involved with the shul's Men's Club. Encouraged by Craig Artel, Marty Golden, and Larry Klioze, Spencer was invited to attend a meeting and... we all know the rest of this story. Over the next 6 years, Spencer would be selected to serve in numerous Men's Club board positions and chair multiple Men's Club events, including the clubs' signature event on December 24th. The HPCT-CAE Men's Club evidently saw something special and put their faith and trust

in this young man to blossom into the leader he is still becoming today.

Ultimately, Spencer became the Club President in July of 2020 at the young age of 31. For most of his term, the world would remain shut down due to the Covid-19 Pandemic. Spencer, along with his Men's Club board of officers and trustees, kept the HPCT-CAE Men's Club afloat during the tumultuous time. As the world reopened, Spencer opened the 2021 Steak and Scotch event with two words: "Welcome Home!"

Spencer's involvement in his shul was a reflection upon his family's tradition of synagogue leadership. His great-grandfather, and namesake, Samuel (z"I) was one of the head *gabbyim* of his synagogue. Spencer's maternal grandparents, Irving (z"I) and Linda, were both past presidents of Men's Club and Sisterhood. Throughout the final years of his grandfather's life, Spencer would ask for guidance, President to President. These conversations were the essence of לְדוֹר וְדוֹר (*I'dor va'dor*, generation to generation). Spencer's mother is a past synagogue president in Cranford, and his stepfather held the position of treasurer at multiple synagogues. These great role models helped shape Spencer as he started the 4th generation of his family's involvement in synagogue leadership.

Outside of Men's Club, Spencer is currently the Colonia Middle School Band Director and is the High Holiday Ba'al Tefillah for his home synagogue at TBEMC in Cranford, where he also has directed the TBEMC Choir since his graduation from Mason Gross in 2011. Spencer is completing his Masters in Music Education degree at Mason Gross, with an expected graduation date of May 2025.
