
A graduate of Brandeis University, Eric also received a post-graduate certificate in construction project management from New York University. During his time at







Sarah Renee Bakal is honored to have been chosen as Temple Israel & JCC's YOY. A member for twelve years, she has volunteered at Temple Israel in many capacities, including organizing a sock collection for the homeless as part of JFNNJ's Mitzvah Day and baking desserts for many years for the walk-in dinner program for the food insecure. She helped organize the youth group's food drives for Ridgewood Social Services and has assisted with the annual Hanukkah Toy Drive.

After serving as Freshman Representative on the chapter's USY Board, Sarah Renee moved on to the Hagalil Regional General Board. She is now in her third year on Hagalil's Social Action/Tikkun Olam Committee,

currently serving as the Regional Social Action Awareness Chair. Sarah Renee traveled with USY on Wheels in the summer of 2018 and attended International Convention in Orlando later that year. Sarah Renee has earned the Etz Chaim Award, the highest award offered by the National Jewish Committee on Scouting.

This past summer, Sarah Renee completed her Eagle Scout project at Temple Israel with the help of more than three dozen volunteers, addressing handicap accessibility.



Her project included cleaning, painting and fixing all of the railings, banisters and doors outside the building. In addition, she built a forty-two foot paver walkway to connect the patio to the sidewalk to make the patio handicap accessible. As a member of the Inaugural Class of female Eagle Scouts, Sarah Renee is the first female Eagle Scout in Northern New Jersey.

Sarah Renee has also been an active Girl Scout for thirteen years, where she recently earned the Or Emunah Award from the National Jewish Committee on Girl Scouting. 

He is part of the Madrichim program, assisting the Hebrew school instructors in lesson planning, teaching, and lending support to the younger students throughout the year. With particularly difficult

circumstances caused by the Coronavirus, Josh has been instrumental in facilitating the use of technology to conduct virtual classes. Josh acts as a mentor to the students and helps encourage and enhance their Jewish learning experience. In addition, Josh



capitalizes on his love for movies as an Executive Board member for "Project Aviva," a unique film program for teenagers at the shul. After watching specifically selected films with themes that relate to Jewish ideals and values, students engage in meaningful reflection and discussion. Josh helps lead the planning and execution of all of their events.

Beginning in 2020, amidst the pandemic, Josh answered the call for help from the Jewish Family & Children's Services of Northern New Jersey by serving as a volunteer mentor in their Project REACH Program. This program provides support to those who are struggling with the social isolation and emotional toll of the pandemic. Josh continues to enjoy being a "big brother" to his new-found friend, playing video games, discussing different topics and creating a bond.

In addition, Josh has fostered his understanding of and appreciation for Jewish culture and values each summer for the past 9 years (before COVID) as a camper and CIT at Camp Kinder Ring in Hopewell Junction, New York. There, along with his closest friends, he has enjoyed summer activities while also partaking in programming focused on the camp's mission, of "Making the World a Better Place."

Josh is anxiously waiting to hear about college acceptances and plans to pursue a career in secondary education, teaching history. His experiences at Shomrei Torah have helped to solidify his career plans and given him the opportunity to start developing the skills of an educator.
